



Brian Lux, Rush Pikes Peak Soccer Club, has recently been appointed Director of Coaching - Goalkeeping for the Rush. Brian holds a USSF "A" license, USSF Goalkeeper License, and is a Colorado ODP Staff Coach as well as an assistant coach for the Men's and Women's soccer programs at the United States Air Force Academy.

Brian is excited about his new role and has several goals he hopes to accomplish. He will be creating a goalkeeping manual for Rush, which can then be adapted to an individual Rush club and their specific needs. His vision is that goalkeeper training will be consistent across the club. Brian's passion for the game of soccer and his enthusiasm for developing players/keepers to their maximum potential leave little doubt that he will be very successful as Director of Coaching - Goalkeeping.
